

# Talkin' 'Bout My Generation

This is a Reform UK Scotland Position Paper

In 2014 Scots voted on whether or not they wanted their country to leave the United Kingdom. The result was close but decisive, and we stayed.

There was an informal agreement that the vote would be a "once in a generation" event. However, since that time the SNP have kept up an incessant demand for a repeat of the vote.

Although Reform UK Scotland strongly supports localised distribution of powers, we reject any suggestion that this vote is held again before 2039 (25 years and one generation after the first one). The disruption of our country's life that separation would entail is too significant to be a continual Damoclesian sword.

Instead, we will press ahead with our plans to distribute powers away from Westminster and Holyrood and move them to where they are best exercised - in councils, schools, voluntary organisations and with individuals. This will result in much more independence than removing Scotland from the United Kingdom would.

If we are allowed to carry out our plans there will be no desire for any further constitutional change. The Independence question will have been answered and Scotland will retain its place as a valued member of a supremely successful political union.

Scotland will not leave the United Kingdom.
